Thank you, Chairman Paddie, for the opportunity to present the following information from the American Planning Association - Texas Chapter. My name is **Chance Sparks**, and I represent the American Planning Association - Texas Chapter. We are testifying **in favor of HB 12**. The Texas Chapter of the American Planning Association (APATX) represents public and private sector planners, planning academics and students, elected officials, and citizen planners in the great state of Texas.

HB 12 is an essential tool for local communities to respond to all types of disasters and will help the coordination between state and locals to, hopefully, mitigate the human cost of a disaster.

The proper response to a disaster varies based on the type of disaster. A tornado outbreak is quick forming and leaves little time for an emergency alert but could affect an entire region of the state. Winter storms and hurricanes give a more advanced warning but affect more expansive areas; in both circumstances, an alert system would benefit all communities in the state.

Our communities' resiliency is a legislative priority for APATX this session, and we would welcome any opportunity to work alongside the Legislature to implement a statewide alert system. Our members already work with local communities to improve resiliency and have firsthand experience to enhance the coordination of the state's response to disasters.
